WHO ARE WE?

Founded in Barnsley in 2012, LUNG is a campaign led verbatim theatre company that tours work nationally. We work closely with different communities to make verbatim theatre and hidden voices heard. LUNG creates work that shines a light on political, social and economic issues in modern Britain, using people's actual words to tell their stories.

Harrow Arts Centre (HAC) is the only professional multi-artform venue in the London Borough of Harrow and is committed to providing a journey of a lifetime enjoying the arts for people from every background. We provide year-round public entertainment programming, creative workshops, art, dance and drama classes. We are a community driven facility and our purpose is to enhance the quality of life in the borough by enabling access to, and participation in, the arts for everyone.

MASTERCLASSES

10 weekly online masterclasses with industry leading creatives and professionals working in the arts.

Space and support to make your own piece of work for a scratch night at an Arts Space in Harrow. Work towards gaining a Silver Arts Award

DATES AND TIMES

STAGE 1: MASTERCLASSES

Mid April - July 2021. Over 10 weekly sessions you will be given a series of masterclasses in writing, directing, producing, multi-disciplinary arts and much more. These will be facilitated online.

STAGE 2: DO IT YOURSELF

End of July - August 2021. Weekly sessions will continue for you to share ideas. You will then begin work on making their own piece of work that will be showcased at Harrow Arts Centre's Boiler House in August 2021.

STAGE 3: NEXT STEPS

End of September - October 2021. You will then be invited to attend a final, celebration session at Harrow Arts Centre in September. We will create a bespoke pathway plan for you, signposting you to schemes happening in London future activities at Harrow Arts Centre and ways to develop you as an artist.
